Cut to miscellaneous video of students Performing in an exercise wearing protective equipment	Ambient sound of students working together
Soundbite: Michael Murphy, Fire Fighter, California	“The probability of a large disaster exists every day. Earthquake, fire, or terrorist attack.”
Cut to classroom video with instructor on platform	“It’s important for you, the first responder to go in to an incident, overcome the fear that is naturally instilled, and come out, do what you do at the end of the day, and what is that? Go Home!
Soundbite: Kenneth Garner, Police Lieutenant, Tennessee	“This training gives first responders the confidence to wear the equipment properly and knowing it will protect them to do their jobs.”
Cut to instructor discussing training with students	“After a certain period of time we would pull you off of this line and consider all factors.”
Cut to instructor talking on radio reminding all instructors how long students should wear breathing apparatus	“Northville instructors, two minutes left on air, two minutes left on air.”
Soundbite: Michael Murphy, Fire Fighter, California	“Dealing with mass triage and cutout and mass decontamination, while working with equipment, is different from home. All these are here, and not possible to train with at home. It increases confidence and ability.”
Cut to instructors using nerve agent and students using various methods of detection.	Ambient sound of training
Soundbite: Todd Holmes, Paramedic Student, California	“We got to deal with live agent that no one else gets to work with. I think that as a young student that is incredible. There were guys 50 or 60 years old and this was their first time. I got to do this at a young age and that has helped us grow and have confidence.”

Soundbite: Michael Murphy, Fire Fighter, California	“The center is like no other. Having had the ability to travel around, and go to school at different facilities, as part of a 25 year career, it is an opportunity that every first responder, no matter what their discipline should be here and experience this.”
